## Managing from Afar: Ensuring Leadership and Transparency

This year, we'll be using a different model of management for Project Chacocente, and it should result in the development of stronger leadership skills in the Nicaraguan staff that runs the Project.

Cheryl will be visiting Chacocente four times during the year, taking a couple of weeks each time to train staff, review goals and accomplishments, teach the families, observe children's classes, worship with the families and celebrate life's blessings.

"I already feel that I'm managing better than before because I have to spend more time with the Nicaraguan directors planning and discussing strategy, and not just responding to fires," says Cheryl. "With modern technology, like Skype and email, it's easy and cost effective to talk with the staff daily."

The "four pillars" of management (as they call themselves) in Nicaragua are Gabriel Godinez, project director; Juan Carlos Paiz, family coordinator; Omar Hernandez, delegation and sponsorship coordinator; and Xavier Martinez, school director.

"We are much more organized this year," Cheryl says, "and now that we are an NGO (non-government organization), we're using an accountant to prepare our financial reports. It's a more transparent process."
